### Equipment delivered to Origin's Spring Gully site

Major gas plant construction has started at Origin Energy CSG Limited's Spring Gully property.

Three 90 tonne Universal compressors, three 45 tonne coolers and other equipment have been placed on specially constructed concrete base pads for the Coal Seam Gas Plant.

The large compressors were offloaded in the Port of Brisbane in November following their sea journey out from Galveston, USA. They were due to be shifted by low-loader to the site by December, but heavy rains in the area made the journey to Spring Gully impossible.

Two compressors had to be offloaded at Bungil Shire depot in Roma, and two coolers were stored in the Murilla Shire Council depot in Miles until road travel was permitted for wide loads after the Christmas holidays.

Construction on the gas plant is expected to be completed over the next two months, prior to commissioning trials. First coal seam gas for sale is expected in May 2005.

The Spring Gully Gas Plant is expected to process about 36 TJ (terajoules) of gas per day - enough gas to supply an average house for 2000 years.
