Victoria

Premium Feed-in Tariff Scheme for solar - 60c/kWh rate

1 November 2009 to 31 December 2011

The Premium Feed-In Tariff Scheme (PFIT) closed to new applicants on 29 December 2011.

To have successfully applied to this Scheme, you needed to provide following paperwork to your electricity retailer by 30 September 2011:

- a Premium Feed-In Tariff agreement
- a Certificate of Electrical Safety (CES) and Electrical Work Request (EWR) from your solar installer
- a solar connection form.

You also need to have had your solar system connected to the electricity grid by 31 December 2011 and a premium feed-in tariff applied to your solar installation address by your distributor.

If you successfully applied to this Scheme, then you'll receive a feed-in tariff (FIT) of 60c/kWh until 1 November 2024 as long as you remain eligible.

Key eligibility criteria

- You must make sure that you don't increase your system's generating capacity by adding solar panels to your existing system, even if the system is under 5kW.
- You're unable to have separately metered off-peak appliances, for example: off-peak electric hot water, slab heating, ClimateSaver air-conditioning tariff/metering (controlled loads).
- Your annual electricity consumption at the property must be less than 100 Mwh pa.

If you're participating in this Scheme, you'll also receive Origin's FIT rate of 6c/kWh*. This takes the total FIT to 66c/kWh for any solar electricity exported to the grid.

Important information for PFIT customers switching electricity retailers or moving house

- You can switch retailers and continue to receive the 60c/kWh with your new electricity retailer. All you need to do is enter into a new PFIT agreement with your new retailer.
- If you move into a property where the PFIT is in place, you can expect to receive the rate of 60c/kWh. All you need to do is enter into a PFIT agreement with your retailer for this property.
- If you move out of a property you can't transfer the PFIT to your new property. It remains attached to your original property.

Transitional Feed-in Tariff Scheme for solar - 25c/kWh rate

1 January 2012 to 31 December 2012

The Transitional Feed-In Tariff (TFIT) Scheme closed to new applicants on 31 December 2012.

To have successfully applied to this Scheme, you needed to provide the following paperwork to your electricity retailer by 30 September 2012:

- a Transitional Feed-In Tariff agreement
- a Certificate of Electrical Safety (CES) and Electrical Work Request (EWR) from your solar installer
- a solar connection form.

You also need to have had your solar system connected to the electricity grid by 31 December 2012 and a transitional feed-in tariff applied to your solar installation address by your distributor.

If you successfully applied to this Scheme, then you'll receive a feed-in tariff (FIT) of 25c/kWh until 31 December 2016 as long as you remain eligible.

Key eligibility criteria

- You must make sure that you don't increase your system's generating capacity by adding solar panels to your existing system, even if the system remains under 5kW.
- You're unable to have separately metered off-peak appliances, for example off-peak electric hot water, slab heating, ClimateSaver air-conditioning tariff/metering (controlled loads)
- The annual electricity consumption at the property must be less than 100 Mwh pa.

If you're participating in this Scheme, you'll also receive Origin's FIT rate of 6c/kWh*. This takes the total FIT to 31c/kWh for any solar electricity exported to the grid.

Important information for TFIT customers switching electricity retailers or moving house

- You can switch retailers and continue to receive the 25c/kWh with your new electricity retailer. All you need to do is enter into a new TFIT agreement with your new retailer.
- If you move into a property where the TFIT is already in place, you can expect to receive the rate of 25c/kWh. All you need to do is enter into a TFIT agreement with your retailer for this property.
- If you move out of a property you can't transfer the TFIT to your new property. It remains attached to the original property.

Standard Feed-in Tariff Scheme - 28.83c/kWh rate

1 January 2008 until 31 December 2012

The Standard Feed-In Tariff Scheme (SFIT) closed to new applicants on 31 December 2012.

To have successfully applied to this Scheme, you needed to provide paperwork to your electricity retailer by 30 September 2012:

- a Standard Feed-In Tariff agreement
- a Certificate of Electrical Safety (CES) and Electrical Work Request (EWR) from your solar installer
- a solar connection form.

You also need to have had your solar, wind, hydro or biomass system connected to the electricity grid by 31 December 2012 and a standard feed-in tariff applied to your renewable energy installation address by your distributor.

If you successfully applied to this Scheme, then you'll receive a feed-in tariff (FIT) of 28.83c/kWh* until 31 December 2016 as long as you remain eligible.

From 1 January 2012, the SFIT rate was available to customers who installed eligible small renewable energy generating systems:

- Eligible system sizes for wind, hydro or biomass systems - less than 100KW
- Eligible system sizes for solar systems - 5kW to 100kW

Prior to 2012, the SFIT rate was available if you installed eligible small renewable energy generating systems (solar, wind, biomass or hydro) sized 0 to 100kW.

Key eligibility criteria

- Changes to your existing system may affect your eligibility. You will need to refer to your SFIT agreement and discuss any system changes with your retailer.
- The annual electricity consumption at the property must be less than 100 Mwh pa.

Important Information for SFIT customers switching electricity retailers or moving house

- If you're on this Scheme and switch electricity retailers, you won't be able to access the SFIT with your new retailer. The same rule applies if you move into a property which was previously held by an SFIT participant.
- If you move out of a property you can't transfer the SFIT rate to your new property.
- You may apply to receive the current 6.2c/kWh* Feed-in Tariff Scheme instead.
